A delay of one week in mailing grades was necessitated by errors in grade sheets and in some instances by late grade reports. To those who responded on the forty-eight hour schedule with accurate reports we are indeed grateful.

Drops, Adds, and Changes closed on the scheduled date. Every student was given the second week of school, February 9-14, in which to do this. If students ask you the question "May I add another course?" just say "NO." There will be no more changes from one section to another. Only drops are to be permitted, and should be thoroughly justified.

The Registrar will determine whether the fee is to be paid or not after reading the teacher's report on the reason for the "I" grade.
