RECOMMENDATIONS FOR ROVING SCHOLARSHIP

A Roving Scholarship of \$250 is given annually by the Dallas T.C.U. Woman's club. This is an open competition among students already enrolled in T.C.U. for not less than 12 semester hours academic load. The applicant may submit his application to the head of his major department or directly to Dean Moore, or, any member of the T.C.U. staff may on his own initiative nominate a candidate.

Applications with supporting letters of recommendation should be in the hands of Dean Moore not later than April 1. The award will be made on the basis of the candidate's scholastic record, leadership and character. The recipient will be selected by the Scholarship committee of the University with the approval of the Scholarship committee of the Dallas T.C.U. Woman's club by May 1. If you believe a certain student should have this award ---why not nominate him or her? But, do it now.
