PRE-REGISTRATION FOR THE FALL

President Sadler has issued a statement through the Skiff regarding Pre-Registration, August 2-6, for the Fall Semester. A Brief outline of the plan is given herewith for your guidance. This plan has been agreed upon by the Deans' Council, in keeping with a recommendation presented by the Registration Committee.

August 2,3,4,5,6 (five days only) will be devoted to Pre-Registration. All department heads are urged to have someone to represent them on duty 9:00 to 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 to 4:30 p.m. on these five days that the students may be properly signed as rapidly as possible. Classes will be held as usual.

All students who are now in school or who have been in school during the summer or during the 1947-48 long session shall be eligible for pre-registration.

No new students shall be permitted to pre-register.

Those who pre-register will follow this procedure:

1. Go to Registrar's Office for necessary credentials and materials.
2. Go to major professor or designated counselor (if no major has been declared) where registration card will be filled out and where proposed courses will be listed.
3. Go to various department offices where these specific courses will be scheduled as to section, hour, room, etc.
4. Go back to major professor for check and approval.
5. Go to Dean of School for his approval.
6. Veterans go to the VA Office, Room 205, for processing VA forms.
7. Go to Registrar's Office where all materials will be taken up except identification card.
