A SPECIAL WORD TO THE FACULTY MEMBERS OF THE SUMMER SECOND TERM STAFF

1. Please note the attached instructions for pre-registration for the fall of 1948, to be followed August 2 to 6 inclusive. Your cooperation in having someone from your department available in your office at the hours mentioned, along with the alphabetical list of names, will be greatly appreciated.
2. We had originally planned to use the machine-punched cards at this registration, but according to recent decision, we will not have the machine equipment after September 30. The student will therefore bring to you, along with the new matriculation card, new blank admit to class cards to be filled out and brought back to the office within the routine mentioned on the attached sheet.
3. Additional admit to class cards will be sent to department heads, or at least will be available in the Registrar's Office for emergency use in the event a card is mutilated in registration.
4. Each teacher is requested to keep a tentative roll of students signed up through the pre-registration in each class by way of reference. In September, the official class rolls are to be made from admit to class cards, stamped paid by the business office and we will use the old class roll form in use before the machine equipment was installed.
5. The teachers will no longer receive rolls made up in the machine equipment office, but will receive roll sheets, as stated above, in time for grade reports when called for in the usual routine. When school starts this fall, place in your roll books only the names of students on whom you have a corresponding admit to class card marked paid by the Business Office. Shortly after registration, you will be called upon to report the names of any students who are attending for whom you do not have the proper credentials. This admit to class card is the control card and should be treated with primary consideration.
