While it is true that I signed a receipt for it in March, 1966, that was when you returned it to me after you had performed some tests by Dr. Oliver Schaffer, which I think were nondestructive experiments merely to determine whether it really was a meteorite and showed cosmic ray induced products.

Thereafter, on Jan.. 24, 2968, I shipped it back to you by express and we had some correspondence a out your cutting it. You reported to me about this in your letters of Fab. 29, 1968. See also your letter of March 21 when you sent me some pictures and furtehr information.
