Dear Glen and Jenba,

I thank you for your Christmas card. I have always been lazy, or a non-conformist, and don't send out any, but I appreiate every one I get, and maybe some day I'll reform!

I hope that all goes well with you and that 1973 will be a good year. I had a very good 1972. We made a trip to see the total eclipse of the sun last July 10, by going on a cruise that went 900 miles out in the A-lantic for a viewing spot. The weather was quite uncertain alng much of the path over land in Canada, and a New York group got up this plan of being onshipboard and maneuvering into a clear area, which worked out all right.

Business has been pretty satisfactory but the governmental restraints are quite frustrating.
