TO ALL MEMBERS OF THE FACULTY

President Sadler has asked Dean Jerome Moore, Mr. Don Ver Duin, and the president of the Student Council, Mr. Ben Hearn, to serve as a committee to look into the possibility of having a few assemblies in the big gym each semester, and to plan the programs. Dean Moore has been asked to serve as chairman for the committee for the time being.

The Committee has met and wishes to report to faculty and students, as follows:

1. The assemblies are to be university-wide, for all faculty and students; therefore classes will be dismissed for the one hour at which the assemblies are scheduled.
2. The assemblies will begin on the hour and will be adjourned at 10 minutes to the next hour.
3. They will be held in the big gymnasium this year.
4. The next assembly will be on Tuesday, October 12, from 10:00 to 10:50 A.M. President Sadler will preside. A section will be reserved for the faculty. The students will have charge of a greater portion of the program at the assembly period, but all faculty members are expected to attend. The student leaders have emphasized their desire to enter these assemblies, knowing that students and faculty members are always present regardless of whether the program participants are principally students, or faculty members. The Committee believes this is a wholesome attitude and requests all faculty members to attend next Tuesday at 10:00 A.M.
5. Faculty members are requested to give at once to Dean Moore any suggestions they may wish to make concerning the nature of future assemblies. Students are also being asked to submit their suggestions through the student council. The only other assembly already decided upon this semester is a Thanksgiving Program on Wednesday, November 24, at 10:00 A.M.
