PRE-REGISTRATION COUNSELING

The registration committee, in session, on November 8, made plans for a very systematic pre-registration counseling. It is the hope and desire of the committee that every student will be carefully counseled to the end that proper courses will be planned for the spring semester. This should greatly reduce the number of adds and drops.

It is recognized that many departments have already been doing some very fine work: This is commended and all departments are urged to participate fully and extend this good work to include every student.

The following plan is proposed and the committee invites every teacher to study it carefully and make suggestions for its improvement. Your comments should be sent in immediately if we are to profit by them.

I. Steps in Pre-counseling.

A. Juniors and Seniors.

- Make application immediately for petition sheet to be prepared in registrar's office.
- 2. During pre-counseling period, January 3 to 22, go to registrar's office and pick up petition sheet and/or grade book and schedule card.
- 3. Go to head of major department where courses will be listed, card will be signed, and the card and grade book will be returned by the student to the registrar's office.

B. Freshmen and Sophomores.

- 1. Student will go by the registrar's office during the pre-counseling period, January 3 to 22, and pick up schedule card and grade book.
- 2. Go to the appropriate counselor, who will list the appropriate courses, sign the card, and return by student to the registrar's office.

- C. Notice to department heads and counselors.
- l. The schedule card should have only the courses listed, no sections nor hours.
 - 2. All entries should be in ink and the card should be signed in ink.
 - 3. One alternate course should be listed to be used in case a desired course is not obtainable. This course should be marked "alternate".
 - 4. Department heads and their staffs should schedule office hours so that students may be counseled in a systematic manner.

We realize that this will require some extra effort on the part of all staff members, but we believe it is worth the serious cooperation of all. We invite your earnest and serious participation.
