THE RETIREMENT INCOME PLAN

We, the undersigned committee for completing the final plan for the Retirement Income Plan, wish to make the following announcements:

1. Within the next week, eligible employees for immediate participation in the plan will receive a letter indicating the procedure to be followed. (Eligible employees are regular full-time employees beginning service with T.C.U. on or before March 1, 1948, and being of the age of fifty-five or less at the time of beginning such service.)
2. Any employees who do not receive such letters and who believe they should be considered for eligibility, may communicate by letter with the chairman of the committee and give reasons for such consideration.
3. Blank forms for supplying necessary information for completing application will be included with letter herein mentioned.
4. Applications for membership in plan will be processed during February and March. During that time, employees will have scheduled conferences, if desired, with the chairman of the committee.
5. Eligible employees' contributions of five per cent (5%) of basic salary will be deducted from January salary checks and thereafter.
