A MUST IN RELATION TO DROPPING COURSES

Beginning March 7, all drop cards signed by teachers must show either WF or WP indicating whether or not the student is failing or passing the course at the time it is dropped. This is very important and the teacher should note on his class roll or book this same information so there will be no inconsistency when the final grades are turned in. We have had quite a little difficulty with the fall grades on this point. The teacher would note WP on the drop card when turning it in, then write WF on the final grade report, necessitating an additional transaction and often quite an embarrassment. A greater degree of accuracy in assigning grades will be appreciated.
