CORRECTION IN NEWS STORY

Following the Board meeting on March 4th there was a story in the local papers which might have lead some teachers to assume that another general increase in salary was voted at this meeting.

This is not true. The Board only adopted a new salary scale as a goal toward which we would work. The first news story stated the facts correctly but later stories confused the Board action.

The occasion for the above Board action was that we have just this year (by including all costs of living differential a part of basic salary) reached the salary goals which were set three years ago. The Board thus voted to set up a new scale toward which we would work. This new salary scale will not mean automatic general increases but will give an opportunity for substantial advancements based on merit.
