UNIVERSITY CONVOCATION April 5, 10:00-10:50 A.M.

All classes will be dismissed from 10:00 to 10:50 A.M. on Tuesday, April 5, in order that all teachers and students may hear an address by Dr. T. Z. Koo on the subject: "Students in the New World Order." Dr. Koo is a veteran Chinese statesman and crusader for world peace. He has been very active in work in Youth Organizations since before the First World War. Among the many organizations of trust and honor he has held are those of Executive Secretary and Associate Secretary concurrently of the Student Division of the Y.M.C.A. in China; General Secretary of the Aint-Opium Association in 1922; Vice-Chairman of the World Student Christian Federation from 1928 to 1933; Secretary of W.S.C.F. from 1934 to 1947; and delegate to the following conferences: World Conference of Christian Youth, Amsterdam, in 1939; and the United Nations Conference, in San Francisco, in 1945.

Dr. Koo will speak in the Basketball Gymnasium at the 10:00 o'clock hour, and will speak again in the Auditorium of the Administration Building on the evening of April 5, at which time his subject will be "China--the Present Situation."
