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SECOND SEMESTER REGISTRATION

Registration for the second term of the summer session will be held Monday, July 18th, in the Registrar's Office. Hours will be 9:00 A.M. to 12 noon and 1:00 to 4:30 P.M. Drops and adds will be handled the same day. Students who have registered and are making no changes in class schedule will not have to report on the 18th. Classes will begin on Tuesday, July 19th.

All department heads are reminded that some representative of their department, with authority to approve adds and drops, should be on duty in the department during the above office hours.

The Book Store will issue books for the second term on July 14, 15, 16 and 18th. Veterans attending T. C. U. for the first time and cash students must present their enrollment cards in order to obtain their books. A limited number of books will be bought July 15th. A list of the books will be posted on the Book Store bulletin board.

Men now living in the dormitories who have registered for only the first six-weeks term, but now plan to stay for the second term, must report at the dormitory office, Room 111, to change their room cards. Students who have registered for the second six weeks but do not plan to attend should report these changes in order to clear their room card records.

The dormitory office will be open between the summer terms.

Women who plan to remain for the second summer term should consult Miss Alma McLendon, acting Dean of Women, to make arrangements for their rooms.
