Dear Mr. Monnig:

I have your letter of November 26, and please be assured that I will be glad to talk to you on any occasion you find it convenient to make the trip to Deport.

I have completed the form you sent, used by the American Meteor Society, which I return herewith.

I believe the form gives practically my complete information, but to supplement it, I might add that at the time I saw the fireball I was at a house then owned by Nathan Grant about one and one-half miles east of Deport in Red River County. This place or farm is now owned by Raymond Nobles of Deport. This is the general vicinity where the iron meteorites have been found and I feel confident that these meteorites came from the fireball I saw. I do not know of any other possible meteorites; nor do I know the names of any of the finders of the iron meteorites, although there were several boys on the John G. Wright farm who plowed up some in their fields.
