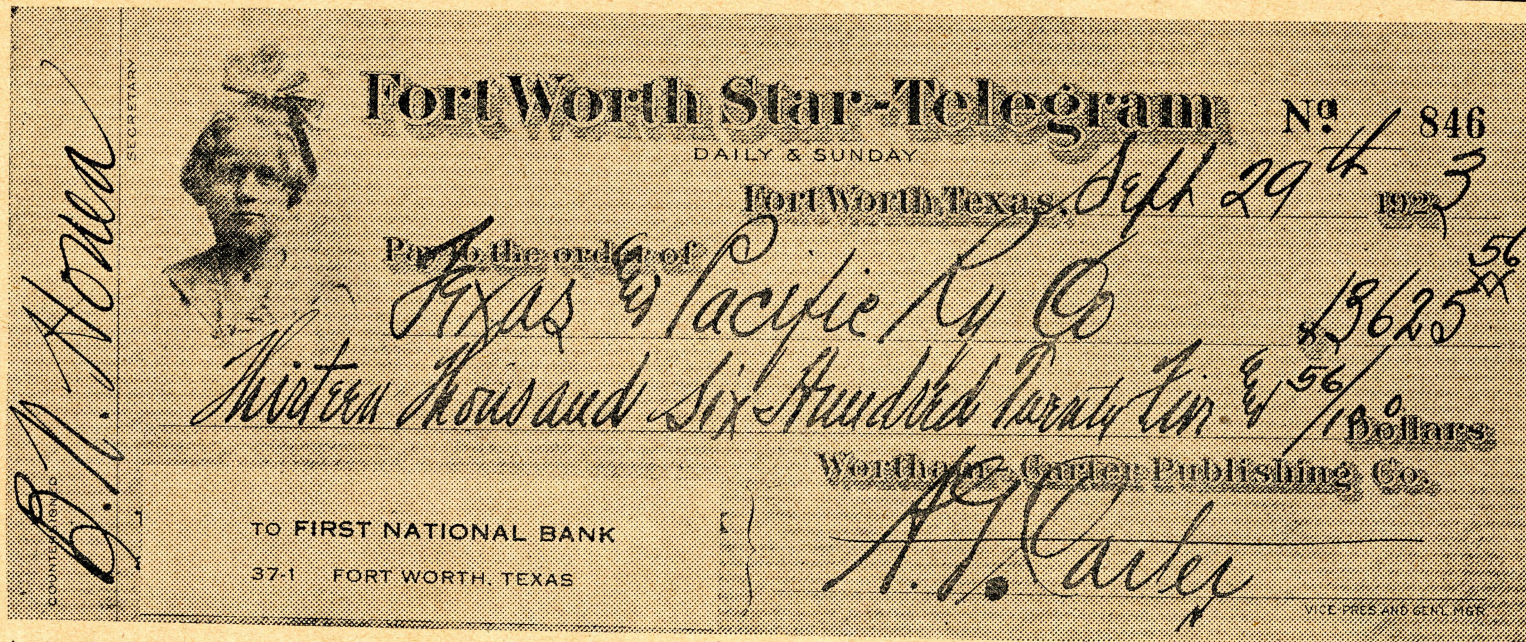


# STAR-TELEGRAM DIXIE SERIES SPECIAL TRAINS COST \$13,625

Orleans games played in this city. The amount, \$13,625.56, is believed to be one of the largest ever paid a railroad for special trains from one point to another for a like event. Besides sending two trains straight through from Fort Worth to New

Orleans the Texas and Pacific attached five extra Pullmans to the Friday Sunshine Special to care for fans going to New Orleans for the games.

A total of 425 passengers was handled by the road for the series.

Bert Honea, secretary of The Star-Telegram, handed the check to J. R. Dalby, city passenger agent of the Texas and Pacific, Saturday. The amount covered transportation. Pullman accommodations and meals for the round trip.
