

TO HEADS OF ALL DEPARTMENTS

The head of each department has the responsibility of keeping up with the petition sheets of all majors in his department. In some departments a student does not need to have a petition sheet made until he has completed the sophomore year, but some departments have found it advisable to start a petition sheet on each student majoring in his department as soon as he declares his major, even though he may be a freshman. I suggest that the head of each department analyze the method followed in his department, and I am asking that he give me a succinct statement of how petition sheets are being handled with regard to freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors. At present, we are to present to the Registrar all names of students majoring in our department who are to complete their work for a degree by January 30, 1950. We are also to turn in to the registration office the petition sheets for these candidates in order that they may be checked to determine whether they are up to date. Please take time out now to be sure that the Registrar has the names and petition sheets of all students majoring in your department who will complete their work in January, 1950. Use whatever method you follow to be sure that you have in your files the names of all students, regardless of rank, who are majoring in your subject. Any suggestions on your part as to how we may improve our system of advisement in the junior and senior years will be appreciated.
