The Department of State has recently announced that awards are now available under the Fulbright Act for American citizens to lecture or do advanced research during the academic year 1950-1951 in institutions of higher learning in Egypt, India, and Iran. Applications must be filed with the proper authorities by June 15 of this year. The fields of study are specified in some instances and most of the openings are to be filled by college professors. It is not essential that applicants have a knowledge of the language of the country for which application is made.
