## TO REMIND YOU

Repeating for emphasis an announcement appearing in the Faculty Bulletin of last week, your attention is called to the need for the list and petition sheets of January 1951 candidates. These should come from department heads and deans charged with the responsibility of keeping these active and up to date. Please turn these to the Registrar not later than October 15. By sharing in this responsibility with accuracy, the list may appear at a reasonably early date.

October 14 is the last date for dropping courses without grades being shown. After that date a course dropped must show either "WP" or "WF". There can be no exception in justice to all concerned.

Of course it is now too late to register, to change a course section or to add a course. We have had but little difficulty with those who were accurately and satisfactorily registered.

## PLEASE ADVISE YOUR STUDENTS

October 10 is the last date for the removal of an "I" grade left from the second term of the summer. Students desiring to remove an "I" grade should come to the Registrar's Office, secure the permit, take it to the Business Office to care for the fee of \$2.00, then take it to the teacher where the permit remains until the "I" has been cleared. The teacher will then send the permit (report) to the Registrar's Office. No teacher should receive make up work until the student produces the permit properly filled out. Where the fee is to be remitted the Registrar will make such notation, based on the report the teacher sent in when the semester or term grades were reported indicating the reason for the "I".
