- 3. Vice-President Nielsen would be responsible for the allocation ans use of all office space and class rooms.
- 4. Vice-President Nielsen and Mr. Hutton would be responsible for the scheduling of classes and for the publication of the schedules.
- 5. Vice-President Nielsen would be responsible for the preparation of the College calendar.
- 6. Dean Richardson would become Chairman of the Scholarship Committee and all scholarships given throughout the entire University would be cleared through his office.
- 7. Dean Richardson would be responsible for checking the grades of scholarship holders.
- 8. Vice-President Nielsen and Mr. Hutton would compile and make permanent records of all teacher loads and reports for the University.
- 9. Vice-President Nielsen would become Chairman of the Classification Committee.
- 10. Vice-President Nielsen would become Chairman of the University Curriculum Committee.
- 11. Vice-President Nielsen would be responsible for any and all student assemblies.
