REMOVAL OF "I" GRADES

All faculty members are requested to remind their students that "I" grades left over from the fall semester which closed January 27, 1951, must be cleared not later than February 28. The routine procedure runs like this:

1. Student goes to Registrar's Office for permit.
2. Student takes permit to Business Office where the \$2.00 fee is cared for.
3. Student then takes the permit to the teacher.
4. The teacher is then in position to receive the necessary make up work to remove the "I".
5. Teacher, using the permit, reports grade to the Registrar's Office where the grade is recorded.

"Quite an operation", but rather simple and proves successful if the routine is followed.
