1. Registration will proceed in this order and at these places:
 - (1) Graduate students - June 1, 2, 4 in Graduate Office and in the Education Office.
 - (2) Brite College of the Bible (graduate) - Brite, June 4
 - (3) Evening College - Library, 6:00 to 9:00 June 4
 - (4) Undergraduate Students (and those not specified) June 4 in the Library beginning at 8:00 A.M.
2. A Period of Pre-Counseling set for May 7-12 will give ample opportunity to prepare for the period of registration.
3. Registration Instructions giving further detail will be available in due time and will be sent to every faculty member.
4. As Registration is a cooperative procedure we will depend upon the fullest cooperation of all concerned. Accuracy will help.
5. If the student desires to attend for the entire TWELVE WEEKS he should sign up for all courses June 4, or as provided above.
6. Any necessary Drops, Adds or Changes may be received on June 6 and 7 - not before.
7. The last day for adding a course for the first term will be Thursday, June 7.
8. The last day on which a student may register for the first term will be June 7.
9. Beginning June 15, all Drops must show "WF" or "WP".
10. Classes will begin Tuesday morning, June 5.
11. On the same routine as outlined above the second term line-up will follow this schedule:
 - (1) New registrations, Monday, July 16.
 - (2) Classes will begin, Tuesday, July 17.
 - (3) Drops, Adds, Changes, Wednesday and Thursday, 18, 19.
 - (4) Last day for adding or for new registrations, July 19.
 - (5) All Drops must show "WF" or "WP", beginning July 27.
