CANDIDATES FOR GRADUATION, AUGUST 27

1. Grades on these students are to be turned in at the Registrar's Office not later than noon, Friday, August 24. This means that these students for the most part may take their final examinations along with other students, but the grades are due not later than noon and must be turned in directly to the Registrar's Office. When you receive the list of these students, they will be stamped accordingly, "Return to Registrar's Office." It is imperative that every teacher who has in any of his or her classes candidates to receive degrees August 27 should turn these names in as requested for the records must be checked and the copy must be in the hands of the printer not later than the following morning, Saturday, August 25.

Your cooperation in meeting this schedule will enable us to get the grade run through before the electricity is turned off for four days, August 29, 30, 31, and September 1, while new electric cables are being placed in the University building. Again we say it is imperative that this schedule be followed rigidly and we will appreciate your cooperation.
