A FACULTY SEMINAR ON RELIGION IN COLLEGE TEACHING

"A Seminar on Religious Perspectives for College Teaching for College and University Faculty Members in all Curricular Areas Except Religion" will be conducted by Southern Methodist University at Perkins School of Theology June 23rd- July 12, 1952. The intention of the seminar is to go beyond the initial phase of proposing a religious perspective in college teaching. They intend to analyze and interpret the main elements in such a perspective and the chief problems involved in developing it in academic fields other than religion.

The seminar will have three programs:

- (1) The Theistic Perspective in College Teaching-- Leader: Prof. Albert C. Outler, S.M.U.
- (2) Christian Ethics and the University-- Leader: Prof. Robert E. Fitch, Pacific School of Religion
- (3) Religion on the Campus-- Leader: Dean Merrimon Cuninggim, Perkins School of Theology, S.M.U.

The intention is that all seminar members participate in all three types of seminar sessions, and that the amount of time spent in all sessions together equal the usual full-time program of a student.

The expenses will be as follows:

Tuition - - - - -	\$50
Room and Board - - - - -	50
Incidentals, including meals for Sundays - - - - -	15
Total - - - - -	\$115

The Danforth Foundation is providing 25 scholarships of \$115 each.
