In reply to yours of the 24th instant I am sorry to say that I can not give you much information about the first editions of my little books. *Departmental Duties I know is practically unattainable in its original form. Plain Tales was quoted somewhere at a fancy price and the form of the Indian Railway library books was against their standing wear for more than a month or two. Thacker Sherrin in Calcutta might help you to a first Plain Tales and A. H. Wheeler & Co. Allahabad, U. W. P. India, might say where the Railway books could be got: but I fancy both cases are very doubtful.

I am rather an enthusiast on head and tail pieces and love to see a well made up book for half of

our first impressions come from a
books outside. Therefore I have
to thank you much for the daintily
little volume you have so kindly
sent me.

One of these days an American
will come along and write a
novel of the colonial period (rich
and fascinating it is) which will
take people captive. There must
be men of golden material
in those years.
