The meteorite catalogs show a San Luis Potosi iron more generally known as Charcas and known since 1804 said to have originally been over 780 kg in a churchyard at Charcas where it had been brought from 12 leagues distance; it was taken to Paris in 1866 and is a medium octahedrite. Another iron, also a medium octahedrite, sometimes called San Luis Potosi but better known as Descubridora, was found between 1780 and 1783, said to weigh 576 kg. and is mainly still in Mexico City. In 1855 another mass of 41½ kg. was found near Catorce and this is mainly in Vienna; the two are very similar and are perhaps related to Charcas. The piece now reported to you could be another one of this nest, and I have some correspondence here from a friend of mind who was recently down in that region that I want to look up; I think he mentioned something from San Luis Potosi. I would be willing to pay you \$25.00 DATE
