There's nothing unusual about Muskogee playing host to a Fort Worth resident. But Robert Brown is different. And he's different because he has a hobby that few men, very few men, follow.

He spends his spare time huntting METEORITES.

A meteorite, in case you don't know it, is a fragment of a meteor. Brown was in Muskogee "on the trail" of a meteor that fell in eastern Oklahoma near Sallisaw, June 8, 1920. He knows it fell then because local papers carried quite a story at the time and because he has found several people already who remember having seen it.
