

Lovell Okla, December 7, 1936

Dear Mr. Monnig:

Referring to our telephone conversation Saturday December 5th in regard to the clipping I mailed you with reference to Mr. Cutter a farmer having some pieces of the meteor that fell near here last summer. I called on Mr. Cutter Sunday morning and taken a good look at the rocks he had and which he thought were some of the meteor. He does not have any of the meteor like Mr. Brown found. He has a large piece of coal with slack coal within it and some cinders, that is, small pieces of cinders. I asked if there had not been a threshing machine engine near where he found what he thought was part of the meteor and he stated there had been a few years ago. I told him to save what he had and when Mr. Brown was up in this territory again that I would have him to call and take a look at them. This he promised to do. I am positive he does not have any meteor rocks, as I find in my coal house here at the station the same article like he has. Mr. Cutter says the people around the community where he is are all looking for pieces of the meteor and no doubt at some time some of them will run across some more pieces. Thanking you for your kindness and anything I can do to assist you at any time I will be more than glad to do it. Tell Mr. Brown hello for me.
