CONCERNING STUDENT HELP

Rules worked out last year by the Administrative Committee to govern student pay rate are repeated here for the purpose of asking the cooperation of the faculty:

1. We pay \$.60 to \$.75 per hour.
2. All student pay will be determined by the Business Office.
3. No raise above \$.60 will be made on the application of the student. Recommendation for advancement must be made to the Business Office by the Chairman of the department in which the student is working. These advances will be granted if the Business Office considers them merited. All students who are employed by the University for the first time will start at \$.60 per hour. Consideration will be given any student who shows exceptional ability for the work assigned.

Because of several embarrassing developments within the past several months, the faculty is now being asked to cooperate in making sure that a student is not employed who has been trained by another department. Students are employed and paid for by the University, and no student shall be offered employment by one department which would take the student away from another department without an agreement in advance by the two chairmen concerned and with the approval of the Business Office
