NEW ORGAN

More new equipment was added to the Religion Center Friday. A semi-trailer truck delivered the parts for the new organ to be placed in Robert Carr Chapel.

The organ was custom built by the Reuter Organ Company of Lawrence, Kansas, specifically to meet the needs of the School of Religion. The wooden pipes and all woodwork throughout the organ is solid mahogany. All metal pipes are of an alloy of tin and lead. The console is finished in white to match the furniture in the chapel, with a mahogany top and trim. The inside facings of the console are of walnut.

The organ is composed of three divisions, Great Organ, Swell organ, and Pedal Organ, playable from a two-manual console. The instrument will be divided, half on each side of the Chancel, and both chambers will be under expression. The expression is achieved through the manipulation of 36 separate shutters which cover the entire tonal openings into the chancel. The draw-knob console will control 14 individual sets of pipes totaling nearly 100 pipes. Two expression pedals control the swell shutters; twelve thumb pistons control pre-arranged combinations of stops.

The organ will be erected within the next month, but the finish work on its voicing and tuning will not be done until all the furniture and appointments are installed in the Chapel. In that way, the organ will be voiced to fit perfectly into its new home. (We came by the above information from an expert -- Emmet Smith.)
