POLICY ON EXAMS, ETC.

To assist the faculty, Dean Jerome Moore of AddRan Suggests:

- 1--It is the policy of the University NOT to give a final exam to ANY student earlier than time scheduled. To do so for one is to set a precedent which would work a hardship on the entire staff in dealing with others. It is agreed that it is better to give an "I" in case of emergency and permit student to take exam later than to give a final exam early for any reason.
- 2--In answer to the question as to who must meet the general degree requirements in Government and American History, your attention is called to the original ruling by the Deans Council, which was reaffirmed recently that the requirements must be met by all students who entered TCU as late as September, 1952.
- 3--In most cases the dean of the college is the person to whom curricular questions should be referred when the student or departmental counselor needs help in solving a problem. However, any exceptions to meeting general degree requirements must be submitted to the Classification Committee for approval.
