

THIS WEEK'S SPOTLIGHT PERSONALITY:

Mabel I. Major, professor of English, for her fine leadership in the annual Creative Writing Day celebration. The 1954 event will be held Friday.

Mabel was born in Ogden, Utah, and after moving to Paris, Mo., took her B.A., B.S.E. and M.A. from the University of Missouri. She has done graduate study at the U. of Chicago and Columbia. After teaching high school in Higginsville, Mo., and Big Spring, she came to TCU in 1919 as assistant professor. She was made associate in 1923 and full professor in 1938. She has traveled in Europe, Mexico and Canada.

An expert on Browning, Shakespeare and others, she is better known perhaps as an outstanding authority on the literature of the Southwest. With Rebecca Smith, she wrote "The Southwest In Literature" in 1929. She has written and co-edited seven other books and more than a score of articles. She is a member of the Texas Folk-Lore Society (president 1936-37), the Texas Institute of Letters (vice-president 1947-49), the Modern Language Ass'n., the Texas Poetry Society, the Texas Conference of College Teachers of English (president 1953). She is a member of the Woman's Club and Delta Delta Delta. She has twice had Carnegie grants for teaching and research.

Known fondly to many generations of TCU "authors," Mabel Major has helped guide many a student in first efforts at writing. Many of her young people have become distinguished poets and writers in many fields. For her great ability, long service and kindly guidance and leadership, The Bulletin is proud to salute her this week. May her fine work go on forever.
