REGISTRATION PROCEDURES -- SECOND SIX WEEKS
SUMMER SESSION 1954

Registration for the Second Six Weeks, Summer Term II, will be on Monday, July 19. Each department and academic Dean is expected to have a representative present in his office during the hours from 9:00 to 12:00 noon and from 1:00 to 4:30 p. m. in order that the necessary counseling, enrollment in courses, and signatures may be secured by those registering and processing changes.

Those students who enrolled for the full summer session at the time of registration for the First Six Weeks will not need to report on July 19. However, if such students desire to make a change in their schedule (Adds, Drops, Change in Sections) they should do so on this date.

Those students who registered for the First Six Weeks only and now desire to attend the Second Six Weeks, should process the necessary Add Cards on this date.

Those students who were not in attendance during the First Six Weeks will initiate their registration by reporting to the Office of the Registrar.

Classes will begin at 7 a. m., Tuesday, July 20.

The last day for late registration, changing or adding courses will be Friday, July 23.
