FACULTY LUNCHEON PLANS ANNOUNCED

The first of the Fall series of weekly faculty luncheons was well attended in Weatherly Hall Wednesday. Movies of the Oklahoma game, film by Athletic Director L. R. (Dutch) Meyer, were enjoyed. Dutch promises more game films during the season.

There is still time for everybody to join in the fun at these weekly affairs. Fourteen dates are still on the docket: Oct. 3, 13, 20, 27, Nov. 3, 10, 17, 24, Dec. 1, 8, 15, Jan. 5, 12, 19.

To make things more flexible, the following plan for the luncheons has been worked out:

- 1--Those who wish may make permanent reservations and by paying \$10.50 in advance, save \$1.40 for the season. It is hoped that most of the group will take this plan.
- 2--Those who wish, may make permanent reservations but pay at each meeting (85¢). Members of this group, who find they'll be unable to attend any week, must notify Mrs. George P. Fowler by 4:30 p.m. MONDAY or they must be charged for the meal.
- 3--Those who can attend only a few meetings. These folks must notify Mrs. Fowler by 4:30 p.m. of MONDAY of the week they plan to attend and will be charged 85¢ a meal. This plan will also apply to ALL GUESTS.

The plan is frankly an experiment and may have to be changed if it doesn't work out. (We can't lose any money). So be prepared next Wednesday to let those in charge know which plan YOU wish.

STUDENT GROUP MEETINGS ON THURSDAY

Next week, Oct. 7, the 11-12 open period on Thursday will be used for any group meeting desired, Vice-President Lindley points out. There is no assembly program that day.
