

NEW PLAN FOR DEVELOPMENT

Dr. Sadler's new 10-year development program got enthusiastic endorsement from the Board last Saturday. Several members, recalling their deep doubts when the "young and inexperienced president" proposed his first program back in 1942, vied with each other to move the adoption of the new one. The entire group gave the president a rising vote of thanks for the great work done so far. It was a happy and harmonious meeting.

In case you missed it, the new blueprint calls for \$5,200,000 in buildings. New ones: School of Business, fieldhouse, boys' dorm. To be enlarged and/or revamped: Library, Ad Building, Jarvis, Clark, Goode, old Brite. Dr. Sadler explained that there is no hard and fast priority on these needs, but that the library should come first. The Board heartily agreed.

The plan also calls for \$650,000 in additional annual income for scholarships, \$168,000 for new teachers, \$100,000 for pay increases to present staff and \$70,000 for research and library. It's a whopping big program but members of the Board, looking at what has been accomplished in the past decade, seemed confident the new goals can be reached. Nothing like having a real target, folks.

THE RESOLUTION ON POLICY

For the information of all, the resolution passed by the Board on the matter of employees read in full:

"Be it resolved that it is the policy of the Board of TCU to employ no person, in any capacity whatsoever, who is a known member of or otherwise affiliated with any organization, group, society or other association which advocates, encourages, abets or teaches, by written or spoken word, the duty, necessity or propriety of, or has among its objectives or purposes changing the form of the government of the U. S. or the State of Texas by any means other than those prescribed by the respective laws and constitutions thereof;

"Be it further resolved that membership in or affiliation with such an organization, group, society or other association is regarded by the Board as inimical to the maintenance of basic academic freedom and will subject such person or persons to dismissal from TCU after a fair trial in accordance with established academic procedures."

In the discussion, it was pointed out that this simply formalizes a policy of long standing and will in no way impair complete academic freedom. Dr. Sadler expressed the firm conviction that TCU has never had an employee who would be subject to action under the resolution. The tricky "guilt by association" angle was discussed and it was felt that the words "established academic procedures" would assure adequate safeguards.

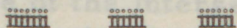
DR. NOEL KEITH--DEBATER

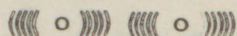

THANKSGIVING LUNCHEON FOR FACULTY

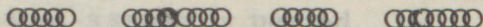
