WHY STUDENTS CAME TO TCU

Capt. Harvey Dockery of AFROTC has completed a most interesting study for Dr. Leslie P. Evans in Education 353. "Dock" set out to discover from our freshmen the main factors for selecting TCU for their education. The results are so interesting we think they should be passed along to all.

The Study shows that of our 655 daytime frosh, 450 or 68.7% answered the question-naire. Granting there may be minor errors and some prejudice in answering certain questions, the tabulation shows that the incoming freshmen selected TCU for three main reasons: Curriculum 21.55%; scholarship grant 20.2%; geographical location 14.2%.

Other reasons given were: Parents desire 9.5%; friends attending TCU 9.1%; family tradition 4.2%; visitations by faculty members to high schools .9%; high school career conference on campus .7%; social life .4% and others 6.4%.

Some 67 indicated more than one main reason or no main reason at all. As for our Career Conference, which was held for the first time last winter, 32 of our freshmen attended and 16 said that the visit to the campus on that occasion was a definite factor in their decision. It is believed this figure can be increased with time and our 1955 Conference is set for Jan. 28.

In any event, thanks to Capt. Dockery for a most interesting survey and to his professor for letting us peep at the paper.
