DR. POMERAT TO SPEAK



FACULTY FELLOWSHIPS PROGRAM

The announcements of the program for Faculty Fellowships 1955-1956 of the Fund for the Advancement of Education have been received by Dean Moore's office along with application forms.

Objective of the fellowships is "to strengthen college teaching in the liberal arts and to stimulate widespread consideration of the purposes, means and ends of liberal education." Fellowships are available in the humanities, social sciences and natural sciences but not in the professional subjects. The Ph. D. is not a requisite.

Any interested teacher, between ages 30 and 45, is requested to discuss the matter with Dean Moore before Jan. 7. Final applications and nomination of candidates must be submitted by the university administration in January. The number of candidates from TCU cannot exceed four. Are you interested?
