EULA LEE CARTER was on the program for the opening of the Annie Webb Blanton dorm at the U. of T. recently.

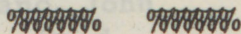

LITTLE THEATER SCHEDULE

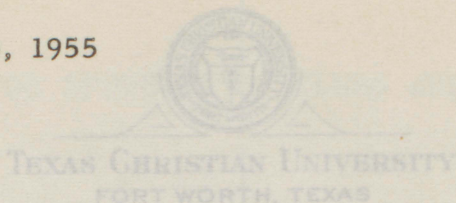
For those who like to plan ahead, here's the list of offerings by Drama Department in Little Theater this season:
