INFORMATION ABOUT FELLOWSHIPS

Faculty members interested in applying for a Danforth Foundation Fellowship for 1956-1957 should contact Dean Moore immediately. Deadline for nominations is Oct. 15 (Saturday), so there isn't much time.

Other deadlines are Dec. 15 for the Ford Foundation's Foreign Area Training Fellowships and the International Relation Training Fellowships. These are for faculty members under 40 years of age in the social sciences and humanities, who wish to relate their studies to Asia, the Near East, Soviet Union, Eastern Europe and Africa.

Deadline for the Southern Fellowship Fund grants for advanced study or research is Dec. 15. Bulletins are posted on campus. The Fund also makes grants for Summer, 1956, advanced study with a deadline of Dec. 31.

Material concerning Fullbright Fellowships for faculty is in the hands of Dr. Comer Clay. The October deadline has passed but there is another in April.
