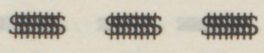
BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION FOR S.C.

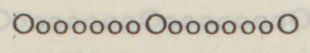

DR. DALE'S STUDY PUBLISHED

A tip-of-the-sombrero this week to Ed Dale of biology-geology. His "Preliminary Survey of the Flora of the Arbuckle Mountains" was printed in the March issue of the "Texas Journal of Science" and has been re-issued in pamphlet form.

Looks like the study, started back in his M. A. days at the University of Oklahoma in 1940's, will give Ed the first difinitive work in the field. His check list shows 867 plants for the area and more are expected to be added. He'll continue his work this summer on a TCU faculty grant for research. Fine work.

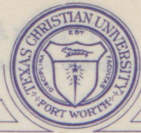
