The group includes Allen Tate, John Crow Ransome, Robert Penn Warren and Harold Davidson. As an authority in the area (her book on the writers is now being revised for publication by the LSU Press), Louise was one of eight critics specially invited to take part in the closed sessions. The conference was sponsored by the American Studies Association and financed by the Rockefeller Foundation.
