Registrar Calvin Cumbie reports a first six-weeks enrollment of 1,832 for the summer session. This compares with 1,634 for 1955 or an increase of 12 percent.

All divisions, with the exception of Brite, were up. This year's figure compared with last: Day School (undergrads) 1006 to 969; Evening College 521 to 392; Graduate School 254 to 212; and Brite College 51 to 61.

Mr. Cumbie believes that with the second six-weeks term we'll hit around 2,000 for the over-all Summer figure. Very good.

## USE OF FACILITIES CLARIFIED

Increasing demand for the use of University facilities by outside groups and the prospects of growing enrollment caused the Committee on Use of Facilities to hold a lengthy meeting recently. It ended in a full committee conference with Pres. Sadler.

The upshot: The policy on granting use of any of our facilities will be more strictly enforced. That statement of policy, first issued in October, 1955:

"The expanded enrollment in our student body has so strained both our facilities and the personnel required to service those facilities that it has become necessary to limit the use of those facilities to groups that are integral parts of TCU or that are integrally connected with the TCU program. The use of facilities by any group will not be approved if the schedule interferes with regularly assigned classes. The exception to the above will be the use of Robert Carr Chapel and Weatherly Hall for WEDDINGS and RECEPTIONS."

Even those groups which can meet the requirements above MUST fill out an application blank and forward to the chairman of the Committee at least two weeks prior to the use of any facility. Faculty and staff members approached by anyone who wishes to use buildings, rooms, etc., should point out the above policy and discourage anyone from even making application when the group will not qualify.

Application blanks are now being printed and each person likely to have requests for use of our facilities, will be furnished with pad of these blanks.
