Dear Mr. Morning

I have in my possession what I believe to be a meteorite - either stony or stony-iron. It measures approx. 48 to 51 in. in circumference, and weighs $255 \frac{3}{4}$ lbs. Am enclosing small sample for your analysis.

This was discovered in Scurry Co. in 1937 in a ditch where erosion had uncovered it - and was first noticed because of its unusual weight and the fact that no other stones were like it in that vicinity.

Naturally, ~~if~~ if this is of value I should like to realize as much for the stone as I can - especially as I was out considerable time and trouble in locating it - and quite a bit of expense in acquiring it.

Would be pleased to hear from you if interested, or if convenient would be glad for you to drop by. I live 6 miles N. of Comanche out Beattie Road
