Aug 1, 1973, Walter Wright and I interviewed Mr. and Mrs. Bob Wilson of Box 7, Glorieta, N. M., at their greenhouse in Apache Canyon about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of Canyoncito church.

A Mr. Nick Varela works for them and I think lives in the small house just west of Canoncito that I visited before, just then being built.

The next house west is occupied by Larry Gurule (a?) Box 584, SAnta Fe., whom Wright knew well as he was the former caretaken or janttor of the building where the Palace REstaurant is; this was right in back of Wright's Old Prospector's Shop. IT was built by a man who made his money in uranium, Bokum, I Gu rule apparently owns some acreage as he had byuilt believe. his house (right next to the site of one that had aparently He directed us to a Jeep road up the hill to the burned). NE and we drove up and explored the hill pop. A cheap metal detector Wright had was sensitive to magnetite in the rocks. It operated on an interference signal from a radio station. We found four crater-like holes all about the same diamter with raised edges (6-8- ft across) but Gu rule said they had been dug by the highway dep. looking for gravel sources. We did not go far beyound a fence on top of the hill, but from there could see the greenhouse of Wilsons" and another house (?) across the creek from theirs and farther up.

The Wilson's own ahalf section and some more land, irregular rectagularly shaped, about 375 A (1)

We went by the Ortiz house where I called before but they were gone. We could see their place from the hill top and I would say the line Mrs. Ortiz pointed out to me before (toward a phone pole) as being the direction to the point of find of the specimen La Baz got would run north of where we went.
