As to the Libyan Desert Glass, if that is what it is, I have made inquiries from two persons who deal in such objects. One of them bought a piece, size unspecified, for 50¢ a gram recently, figuring it would sell retail for \$1.00 a gram. Another said it would be worth between \$1.00 and \$2.00 a gram "if the specimen was attractive", whatever that may mean. Some pieces apparently are somewhat layered or include bubbles, which seems to make them more attractive to certain collectors, but it is immaterial to me. From your point of view it would be a good selling argument!
