Were you really serious when you suggested a possible trip to the site of the Goose Lake meteorite find? I believe we talked about this a bit when at the Washington meeting last November.

I do plan to attend the session of The Meteoritical Society at Moffett Field Oct. 25-27. My wife will be along, not for the meeting, but as a vacation, and could presumably stay in San Francisco or some other near-by point while I was absent on the trip-- if we go.

I have not done too much about meteorites this year and won't have any paper to present. I did see a 17½ pound old chondrite in Oklahoma last Sunday; it was found near Springer, Okla., and is in the possession of a geologist who secured it. We plan to try some talking and inquiries in the region in hopes of locating more. The specimen shows the usual broken faces so that there is hope of further finds.
