PARTLY CLOUDY TO CLOUDY WEATHER IS PREDICTED IN MOST SECTIONS OF TEXAS TODAY AND TOMORROW, ALONG WITH MORE TEMPERATURES RANGING INTO THE UPPER 905.

IN ADDITION, FORECASTERS LOOK FOR ANOTHER ROUND OF THUNDERSTORMS

DURING THE AFTERNOONS AND NIGHTS IN NORTHWEST TEXAS, AND POSSIBLY

EDGING INTO THE NORTHWEST PART OF NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS. THUNDERSHOWERS

ARE EXPECTED IN PARTS OF SOUTHWEST TEXAS.

YESTERDAY'S TEMPERATURES RANGED UP TO AN AFTERNOON HIGH OF 105

DEGREES AT PRESIDIO IN THE WEST TEXAS BIG BEND--MAKING IT THE WARMEST

SPOT IN THE NATION. NUMEROUS POINTS HAD READINGS IN THE 905. THE

COOLEST POINT IN THE STATE WAS GALVESTON WITH A HIGH OF 79.

SCORES OF PERSONS OVER A BROAD STRETCH OF EAST TEXAS SAW A LONG FIERY OBJECT GO STREAKING ACROSS THE SKY LATE LAST NIGHT. IT DISAPPEARED, AND 2 OR 3 MINUTES LATER THERE WAS A SOUND LIKE A DISTANT EXPLOSION.

FEDERAL AVIATION AUTHORITIES SAY NO PLANES HAVE BEEN REPORTED MISSING AND THERE IS NO EXPLANATION FOR THE SPECTACLE. IN THE TRAFFIC CONTROL TOWER AT THE TYLER AIRPORT, SAID THE OBJECT LOOKED LIKE A METEOR EXCEPT THAT IT FELL TOO SLOWLY.

WITNESSES TOLD OF SIGHTING THE BRIGHT STREAK IN THE SKY FROM TYLER, LONGVIEW, SULPHUR SPRINGS, MARSHALL AND OTHER POINTS IN EAST TEXAS.

A TYLER MAN, JOHNNY PEAVY, SAID HE WALKED OUTSIDE HIS HOME ABOUT 10:25 OR 10:30 P-M AND SAW--AS HE DESCRIBED IT--"A LONG FLAMING OBJECT--BRIGHT YELLOW FLAMES IN THE FRONT PART AND ORANGE FLAMES IN THE BACK--FALLING IN THE SKY." PEAVY SAID IT APPEARED EAST OF TYLER AND WAS VISIBLE ONLY A FEW SECONDS.
