Some time ago I received the very beautifully done section of the iron meteorite embedded in plastic. Your Mr. Grover Moreland kindly informed me, in response to my inquiry, that this was Ward's Bio-Plastic.

Nothing was indicated as to what meteorite this is, and I am assuming from the shape, the lines, etc., that it is a piece of the Harriman, Tennessee, I submitted to you some years ago. Please confirm this so I can label the specimen properly.

While we are on the subject, I would like to arrange for the return of the rest of the specimen to me, which is my recollection of the agreement. I don't have my file on the subject before me, but I think it was about a 67 pound iron. You can let me know how many slices were cut off and what became of the end piece.
