Dear Oscar,

In reply to yours of June 8th I am sending you a xerox copy of Morley's report on the Haven Chondrite. We obtained a 21.5 gram cut of this stone from Stockwell in 1955. It has a pseudo polish made by Stockwell and on this surface I see condiserable very finely divided bits of metal.

Perhaps if this surface had a better polish I could see the outlines of the chondrules but on this surface I was unable to see these rounded forms. That clue perhaps is the best assistance I can give you in comparing our slice with the meteorite you have our sample only weighs 21.5 grams.
