Dear Oscar:

I have your letter of December 10 commenting on the Charlevoix structure. I believe your information is probably correct about shatter cones first being recognized in material collected from the area rather than on the site. As to who did the identification, I haven't the slightest idea.

At the time Rondot wrote the booklet for the International Geological Congress, which was probably before your trip, there was still considerable skepticism about impact structures.

I have read several articles by Snyder and possibly by Gerdemann, but I don't recall exactly which publications I have read. However, several years ago, I joined a trip led by Snyder and others examining the crypto-explosion structures in Missouri. It was a very good trip and I have forgotten whether or not there was a GSA guidebook covering it. It would seem to me that you would need fairly detailed instructions to get to the critical outcrops.

Lineaments have been with us for a long time, but they are getting a much greater workout now that sea floor spreading and continental drift are currently popular.
