## LAMPASAS METEORITE

In possession of Carl Hinrichs, 3101 Hawthorne, LA 1764; business address 4112 Shenandoah, LA 7488.

The following were consulted at Lampasas in Oct. 1935: Miss Kate Longfield, Moore Hotel, knew nothing personally, but suggested consulting Ollie Davis, son of Geo. Davis, Lometa; or Mr. John Stevens, Lometa; Mrs. John Townsen, on the highway, knew nothing; Mr. Weber, postoffice, not seen; a man outside the Moore hotel, said the event was written up for the Ft. Worth Gazette, and suggested seeing Buddy Williamson at the postoffice; Williams on knew nothing, and said there was a Williamson (or Brown and Williamson?) ranch on the Colorado River and another one just W of N from town; Fred Wolfe, young man at First Nat. Bk. not contacted; Chas. Walchendorfer, School Supt., hotel back of Stokes, knew nothing; Jim L. Frazer, furniture and undertaker, knew nothing; Mr. Tomlinson, at Millican Gro., not seen, but his clerk knew nothing except that he suggested a Mr. Knight, who owned a ranch to the west, and Field & Edwards, who owned a ranch just SE of town or perh. W. of town; Judge J. C. Abney, County Judge, knew nothing; C. B. Talliaferro, collector of arrow heads etc., not seen; J. R. Key, Key Bros. Gro. but found at Keystone Hotel, says the meteorite was found NE of town in a field, brought to town and sold to a jeweler who worked for Key (then running a drig store). The jeweler sold it to a man (Hinrichs?) for \$50. Mr. Pharr, Lampasa Record, knew nothing. The other paper in Lampasas is the Lampasas Leader.

1941, Hinrichs said over the phone (July) that the stone was obtained by his father thru a former student of Hinrichs' Sr. at Iowa City, one Ramsdale or Ramsdell, who is presumably still residing at Lampasas, the new an old man. This same individual sent the elder Hinrichs a number of minerals (several hundred dollars' worth?) from the Central Texas region, inclduing some large calcite crystals. I wrote Pharr at the Lampasas Record for this man's complete name and address July 27.
